### OBSERVATION

From the survey, it was observed that a majority of the students were happy with the curriculum, the Discipline Specific Objectives offered to them, the syllabus and learning materials provided to them, the weightage given to theory and practical course content, syllabus coverage by the faculty, and text books and reference material recommended in the syllabus. Only 2% or less of the students seemed unhappy with the facilities provided to them. So, there is no need of making any changes in the above areas.

**Only in case of Generic Elective subjects 11.2% students opined that they were not allotted the subject as per their choice.**

### RECOMMENDATION

**The Officer-in-charge (Admission) and the Academic Bursar may be advised to sort out the problem during the admission process and during the allotment of subjects and ensure that GE subjects are allotted to the students as per their choice as far as practicable.**

- g. Have you been allotted Generic Elective subjects as per your choice.



You are requested to personally look into the matter and take corrective measures during the admission process for the next academic session.




